The Enoch-Metatron Tradition Andrei A. Orlov 2005 Andrei A. Orlov examines the tradition about the seventh antediluvian patriarch Enoch,

To attend seriously to the contradictory position of rabbis as both within and outside of a provincial cultural economy, says Lapin, is to uncover the historical contingencies that shaped what later generations understood as simply Judaism and to reexamine in a new light the cultural work of Roman provincialization itself.
